

# What To Actually Pack For Ireland

*A one-page checklist from an American living here.*

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## THE NON-NEGOTIABLES

- Waterproof shell jacket (properly waterproof, not water-resistant)
- Waterproof walking shoes, already broken in
- One warm mid-layer (merino, wool, or fleece)
- Universal plug adapter with USB-C
- Two pairs of merino wool socks

## CLOTHING

- Three to five tops you can layer
- One pair of jeans or trousers that dry quickly
- One dressy outfit for a nice dinner (smart casual)
- Sleepwear (Irish hotels can run cool)
- Underwear and socks for one week (laundry is easy)
- A scarf and a light hat

## FOOTWEAR

- Waterproof walking shoes (the pair you'll actually wear)
- One pair of neat flats or loafers for dinner
- No high heels. No new shoes.

## WEATHER & COMFORT

- Compact travel umbrella (bonus, not a substitute for the jacket)
- Sunglasses (yes, really)
- Reusable water bottle
- Small daypack for day trips

## TECH

- Universal adapter (Ireland uses Type G plugs)
- Phone charger and cable
- Portable battery pack
- Headphones

## DOCUMENTS & MONEY

- Passport (valid 6+ months beyond return date)
- A single credit card with no foreign transaction fees
- Small amount of euro cash for pubs and tips
- Driver's license (and IDP if renting a car)
- Printed hotel confirmations for the first night

## TOILETRIES

- Basics only. Irish pharmacies have everything.
- Any prescription medication in original packaging
- Lip balm and hand cream (the wind is real)

## LEAVE AT HOME

- Heavy winter parka
- Multiple thick sweaters
- High heels
- Hairdryer (every hotel has one)
- Travel steamer
- Half of what you were planning to bring

*Pack lightly enough to come home heavy.*
